

Regional Rail Notes

Your next Bud is moving by truck...

ST. LOUIS -- There won't be a shortage of Buds, but the train moving the beer from Anheuser-Busch's brewery here to near-by connections with major railroads will be no more after 124 years of operation. Budweiser beer henceforth will be moving to market via truck. Clydesdales are not an option.

For UTU members employed by the 14-mile Anheuser -Busch-owned shortline Manufacturers Railway, it is no laughing matter.

Anheuser-Busch said it is losing \$700,000 annually operating the railroad after a brick salvage company and a box maker took their freight from the railroad.

Incoming grain and other ingredients will still be delivered to the brewery via rail, but by the larger railroads serving St. Louis and operating over the Anheuser-Busch-owned tracks. April 6, 2011

From the Henderson, KY Gleaner, the train was G274 southbound: A total of 18 CSX train cars derailed about five miles south of Henderson off of Anthoston-Frog Island Road Tuesday afteroon, spilling loads of grain, sources said.

CSX spokesman Bob Sullivan said the train had three locomotives and 81 freight cars. He said it was traveling from Effingham, Ill., to Waycross, Ga., when the derailment occurred around 3:51 p.m.

Robbie Williams, who farms that land for his cousin, Steve Reed, said he and fellow farmer Scott Keach flew up in an airplane above the derailment once they heard about the spill. "We wanted to see how bad a mess we had," Williams said. The derailment is about a half-mile into farm land north of Anthoston-Frog Island Road.

CSX is handling the clean-up of the spill, the cause of which is under investigation.
